## **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE B.Ed**

### **FULL - TIME AND REGULAR PRE-SERVICE TEACHER EDUCATION**

**(With effect from the Academic Year 2021 – 2022)**

#### **1. Eligibility for Admission to the B.Ed. Programme**

A candidate shall be eligible for admission to the B.Ed. programme (in Government /Government Aided/Self-Financing Colleges of Education) leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) provided:

- (i)** The candidates should have undergone 10+2+3(15) or 10+2+4/5 pattern of study and passed the qualifying examination conducted by the respective State Board or CBSE or any other recognized Board of Education / Examination and UG Degree Examination of the UGC recognized Universities in any one of the school subjects offered by the Directorate of School Education at the Secondary / Higher Secondary Education level.
- (ii)** The three year Diploma in Engineering shall be treated as equivalent to +2 course for the purpose of eligibility for admission.
- (iii)** Candidates who have passed the U.G. or P.G. Degree under Open University System with 10+2 pattern of School Education examination shall not be eligible for admission.
- (iv)** Candidates who have studied more than one major subject in Part III/Part IV (under Double / Triple Major System) of UG Degree course should have to choose only one of the main subjects and should have applied for that major subject only. In such cases, marks obtained by the candidates in two / three major subjects shall be taken in to account to arrive at the percentage of marks as stipulated in item (ix) herein.
- (v)** Candidates, who have passed any degree under Additional Degree Programme or lateral entry mode with less than three years duration, are not eligible for admission.

- (vi) Candidates who have passed under four year Dual Degree Programme with two major subjects under Part- III are not eligible for admission.
- (vii) Candidates who have qualified the P.G. Degree in the subjects such as Home Science, Economics, Commerce, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Logic, Indian Culture, and Philosophy with not less than 50% of marks are eligible for admission, subject to the condition that the major subject in the UG and PG Degrees shall be one and the same.
- (viii) Candidates who have qualified the PG Degree (5 year integrated course) under 10 + 2 + 5 pattern of study, shall be considered for admission. In such cases, the marks obtained by the candidates in the first three years (in major and ancillary or allied subjects alone) of the course alone shall be taken in to account for admission to B.Ed. Degree programme for the subjects in Tamil/Urdu (Urdu in Self-Financing Colleges only), English, Mathematics, Physical Science (Physics), Physical Science (Chemistry), Biological Science (Botany), Biological Science (Zoology), History, Geography, and Computer Science. The marks obtained by the candidates in the last two years (4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> year) alone shall be taken into account for admission to B.Ed. Degree programme for the subjects in Home Science, Economics, Commerce, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Logic, Indian Culture, and Philosophy.

**(ix) Equivalent Subjects**

- a) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Applied Mathematics can apply for Mathematics.
- b) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Applied Theoretical Physics, Geo-Physics, Bio-Physics and Electronics, can apply for Physical Science.
- c) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Applied Chemistry, can apply for Physical Science.
- d) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Advanced Zoology, Bio-Technology, Plant-Biology, and Plant Bio-Technology, can apply for Biological Science.
- e) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Environmental Science and Micro-Biology, can apply for Biological Science.

- f) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Applied Geography, can apply for Geography.
- g) Candidates, who have done their UG Degree in Computer Science, Information Technology and Computer Application, can apply for Computer Science.
- h) Post Graduate candidates in Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic, and Indian Culture with not less than 50% (irrespective of their UG Marks) of marks in PG Degree or in the interdisciplinary subject, which are being declared equivalent by the respective University can apply.
- i) Candidates, who have done their PG Degree in Nutrition and Dietetics, are eligible to apply Home Science.
- j) Candidates, who have done their U.G. degree in the school subjects: Tamil/Urdu (Urdu in Self-Financing Colleges only), English, Mathematics, Physical Science (Physics), Physical Science (Chemistry), Biological Science (Botany), Biological Science (Zoology), History, Geography, and Computer Science are eligible for admission to B.Ed. However, those who have done the U.G. in the subjects for which equivalence is not covered under the G.O. are not eligible for admission.
- k) All the B.E./B.Tech. graduates irrespective of their Branch in Engineering/Technology are eligible to study either mathematics or physical science as Pedagogy of School Subject. However the B.E./B.Tech. Graduates in Computer Science related branches and Bio-Technology related branches are also eligible to study Computer Science and Biological Science as Pedagogy of school subject respectively. The reservation of seats for the graduates in B.E/B.Tech in each Pedagogy of School Subject (viz. Mathematics, Physical Science, Biological science & Computer Science) shall be 5% only.
- l) Candidates who have passed Bachelor's Degree in Engineering with not less than 3 years of duration under lateral entry are also eligible for admission.
- x) Candidates with the following marks in the UG Degree are eligible for admission to B.Ed. Degree programme with the subjects such as Tamil/Urdu (Urdu in Self-Financing Colleges only), English, Mathematics, Physical Science (Physics), Physical Science (Chemistry), Biological Science (Botany), Biological Science (Zoology), History, Geography, and Computer Science. The marks

obtained in UG Degree alone shall be taken to arrive the eligibility even if they possess PG Degree in the same subject. For the subject in Home Science, Economics, Commerce, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Logic, Indian Culture, and Philosophy, PG Degree with not less than 50% marks is mandatory and the subjects in UG and PG shall be one and the same.

- (xi) Marks obtained by the candidates in the UG Degree Course Part-III / IV Major and Allied including Practical [*Tamil/Urdu (Urdu in Self-Financing Colleges only), English, Mathematics, Physical Science (Physics), Physical Science (Chemistry), Biological Science (Botany), Biological Science (Zoology), History, Geography, and Computer Science*] alone shall be taken in to account to arrive at the percentage of marks mentioned above. If the candidates possess PG Degree in these subjects, weightage of marks for the highest qualification in the relevant subject will be given as mentioned in the following table and added to the base marks for Ranking. However minimum marks mentioned in the 'item (x)' is mandatory for the subjects in Tamil/Urdu (Urdu in Self-Financing Colleges only), English, Mathematics, Physical Science (Physics), Physical Science (Chemistry), Biological Science (Botany), Biological Science (Zoology), History, Geography, and Computer Science and not less than 50% of marks for the subjects in Home Science, Economics, Commerce, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Logic, Indian Culture, and Philosophy.
- (xii) Weightage for the highest qualification in the same subject will be given as follows and added to the base mark for ranking.
- Candidates with P.G. (Tamil/Urdu (Urdu in Self-Financing Colleges only), English, Mathematics, Physical Science (Physics), Physical Science (Chemistry), Biological Science (Botany), Biological Science (Zoology), History, Geography, and Computer Science) - 4 (four) marks
  - Candidates with M.Phil. - 5 (five) marks
  - Candidates with Ph.D. - 6 (six) marks

- a) Candidates with P.G. (Home Science, Economics, Commerce, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Logic, Indian Culture, and Philosophy.)  
- No marks
- b) Candidates with M.Phil. - 1 (One) marks
- c) Candidates with Ph.D. - 2 (Two) marks

Weightage of 3 (three) marks for participation in any one of the following co-curricular activities will be added.

- a) NSS [with two years enrolment in NSS and with a minimum of seven days participation in the Special Camp at College (U.G. degree) level alone will be considered].
- b) NCC [B or C Certificate at college (U.G. degree) level].
- c) Sports [should have represented the college (U.G. degree) at University/State/National level].

(xiii) Marks obtained by the candidates in the PG Degree [Home Science, Economics, Commerce, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Logic, Indian Culture, and Philosophy] shall be considered eligible for admission, but weightage marks will not be given as specified above.

(xiv) For the students who have done their Bachelor's Degree in Engineering/ Technology, the marks obtained in their Degree shall be taken into account.

(xv) Rounding of the marks to the next higher integer shall not be permitted.

(xvi) The candidates who are qualified in UG Degree under Open University System after passing 10<sup>th</sup> Standard and +2 Examinations shall alone be considered for admission to B.Ed. Degree programme.

(xvii) The candidates who are qualified in UG Degree under Open University System without passing 10<sup>th</sup> Standard and +2 Examinations and subsequently passing 10<sup>th</sup> and +2 examinations are not eligible for admission to B.Ed. Degree programme.

(xviii) Candidates, who have passed PG Degree in Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic, and

Indian Culture without undergoing 10+2+3 pattern of education, are not eligible for admission.

- (xviii) In the case of Differently-Abled (Physically and Visually Challenged) candidates, a minimum pass in the requisite qualification is enough.
- (xix) However, the basis of selection shall be in accordance with the Regulations of the Government of Tamil Nadu/ University Guidelines for Admission to B.Ed. Degree programme in force from time to time.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE OF B.Sc-B.Ed

(With effect from the Academic year 2016-2017)

### 1. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COURSE ELIGIBILITY

a) Candidates with at least 50% of marks in the senior secondary / +2 or its equivalent are eligible for admission as indicated below:

b) A composite institution duly recognized as higher education institution that offers undergraduate or postgraduate programmes of study in the field of liberal arts or humanities or social sciences or sciences or commerce or mathematics or an institution offering multiple teacher education programmes is eligible to have an annual intake of 100 students (2 units).

➤ Admission can be made in each subject in the B.Sc.B.Ed



programme not exceeding 25% of the total intake.

- Admission can be made in each subject in the B.A.B.Ed programme not exceeding 35% of the total intake.

c) The reservation and relaxation in marks for SC/ST/BC/MBC/PWD and other category shall be as per the rules of the State Government.

- In the case of differently abled (Physically or Visually Challenged) candidates, a minimum pass in the higher / senior secondary examination is enough.
- However, the basis of selection shall be in accordance with the Regulations of the University and Government of Tamil Nadu Guidelines for admission to B.Sc.B.Ed/ B.A.B.Ed. programme in force from time to time.

## **2.DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME**

### **DURATION**

The B.Sc.B.Ed programme shall be of four academic years or eight semesters including school based experiences and internship in training. Student teacher shall, however, be permitted to complete the programme within a maximum period of six years from the date of admission to the programme.

### **WORKING DAYS**

- In a year, there shall be at least two hundred and fifty working days per year excluding the period of examination and admission.
- A working day will be of a minimum of 5-6 hours adding up to

a minimum of 36 hours per week. The institution shall ensure the availability of teachers and students for consultation and mentoring – providing group or individual guidance.

#### **PROGRAMME CONTENT**

The programme content for B.Sc.B.Ed and B.A.B.Ed is given in the university syllabus.

#### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

a) Admission shall be made on the basis of merit by the marks obtained in qualifying examination and in the entrance examination or any other selection process as per the policy of State Government/University Administration.

b) At the time of admission to the programme, the student will need to indicate their selection of the pedagogical subject and the seats may be assigned on the basis of order of merit and availability.

#### **4. FEES**

The Institution shall charge only such fee as prescribed by the affiliating body/ State Government concerned in accordance with provisions of National Council for Teacher Education( NCTE) ( Guidelines for regulation of tuition fees and other fees chargeable by aided teacher education institutions) Regulations, 2002, as amended from time to time.

Fixation of fees for four year integrated B.Sc.B.Ed and B.A.B.Ed degree programmes under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Mr. Justice N.V. Balasubramanian, the fee structure has been prescribed as follows:

The fees structure prescribed above will take effect from the academic year 2016-2017 and will be valid for three academic years upto 2016-2017, 2017-2018 and 2018-2019.

The above fee is inclusive of Admission fee, Tuition fee, University Registration and Eligibility fee, Library and Magazine fee, Laboratory fee, Sports fee, Games fee (equipments for Physical Education courses) and Extra Curricular Activities fee, Medical Check –up fee, Teaching Practice fee, Maintenance and Amenities fee and Development fee. It is classified that the above fee fixed is the maximum fee under the various heads and the institutions shall not collect and levy more fee than the fee fixed by the committee

#### **5. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION**

The candidates admitted into the **B.Sc. B.Ed/ B.A.B.Ed.** degree course in the colleges of education affiliated to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University should select the medium of instruction either as English or as Tamil (as per the availability of medium of instruction in the colleges of education). After the last date of admission, Principals of the Colleges of Education should submit the name list along with the medium of instruction chosen by each candidate to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University. Classroom instruction shall be carried out separately for different medium of instruction.

In case, if the admitted candidates prefer to change their medium of instruction at later stage of the course it should be permitted only after obtaining necessary written permission from the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, prior to the publication of Nominal Roll.

Medium of instruction chosen by the candidate to pursue the **B.Sc. B.Ed / B.A.B.Ed.** degree course will be indicated only in the transfer certificate alone.

#### **6. ATTENDANCE**

Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers

Education University should gain 85% (i.e., 107 days per semester) of attendance, failing which they will not be permitted to appear for the B.Sc.B.Ed/ B.A.B.Ed degree examination. However, as per the decision of the Syndicate of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University in its meeting held on 10.08.2010 candidates who are able to gain attendance only upto 75% on medical ground will be permitted to appear for the examination after getting condonation of attendance, adhering to the norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University.

## **7. EXAMINATIONS**

Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University should apply for the written examination and practical examination in the first appearance itself. Candidates who have failed to satisfy the minimum attendance norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will not be permitted to appear for the written examination. Such candidates' appearance in the practical examination will stand cancelled automatically.

### **WRITTEN EXAMINATION**

#### **Passing Minimum for Written Examination**

Each candidate who appears for the written examination in the first attempt shall be declared to have passed the Written Examination only if he or she secures not less than 50% in aggregate in each course with a minimum of 45% in the external examination in each full course and half a course. All other candidates shall be deemed to have failed in the Written Examination. A candidate who fails in one or more courses in the Written Examination shall be permitted to appear again only for those courses in which he/she has failed.

#### **Revaluation / Retotaling/ Xerox copy of Answer Scripts**

Revaluation / Retotaling/ Xerox copy are permitted for those candidates who appear in the main examination only.

Candidates can apply for Retotaling/ Revaluation /Xerox copy of the answer scripts or all the above to the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University within 10 days after the publication of results by paying necessary fees prescribed by the University provided that the candidate must be a student of current batch.

### **Reappearance for Written Examination**

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the written examination within the next two consecutive academic years.

### **PRACTICAL EXAMINATION**

#### **Passing Minimum for Practical Components**

Each candidate should apply for the practical examination in the first appearance. Candidates who have secured not less than 50% in each of the practical activities for which weightage is given shall be deemed to have passed in the practical examination. Others will be treated as unsuccessful candidates in the practical examination. All the records related to the practical components should be made available to the duly appointed Practical Examination Board at the time of Practical Examination and their decision on the marks to be awarded shall be final.

### **Reappearance for Practical Examination**

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the practical examination within the next two consecutive academic years examination only.

### **WRITTEN EXAMINATION**

#### **Passing Minimum for Written Examination**

Each candidate who appears for the written examination in the first attempt shall be declared to have passed the Written Examination only if he or she secures not less than 50% in aggregate in each course with a minimum of 45% in the external examination in each full course and half a course. All other candidates shall be deemed to have failed in the Written Examination. A candidate who fails in one or more courses in the Written Examination shall be permitted to appear again only for those courses in which he/she has failed.

### **Revaluation / Retotaling/ Xerox copy of Answer Scripts**

Revaluation / Retotaling/ Xerox copy are permitted for those candidates who appear in the main examination only.

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#### **Reappearance for Written Examination**

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the written examination within the next two consecutive academic years.

#### **PRACTICAL EXAMINATION**

##### **Passing Minimum for Practical Components**

Each candidate should apply for the practical examination in the first appearance. Candidates who have secured not less than 50% in each of the practical activities for which weightage is given shall be deemed to have passed in the practical examination. Others will be treated as unsuccessful candidates in the practical examination. All the records related to the practical components should be made available to the duly appointed Practical Examination Board at the time of Practical Examination and their decision on the marks to be awarded shall be final.

##### **Reappearance for Practical Examination**

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the practical examination within the next two consecutive academic years examination only.

##### **Classification of Successful Candidates**

A candidate shall be awarded the **B.Sc.B.Ed / B.A.B.Ed** degree if he/she has passed both theory examination and the practical components.

Successful candidates shall be classified as specified hereunder by taking into account of the marks secured in Theory and Practical Examinations separately.

# **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE M.Ed**

## **DEGREE OF MASTER OF EDUCATION ( M.Ed )**

### **REGULATIONS**

**From the Academic Year 2016-2017 onwards**

**The Master of Education programme, generally known as M.Ed is a professional course that prepares prospective teacher educators.**

### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAMME**

A candidate shall be eligible for admission to the programme leading to the Degree of Master of Education provided he/she has passed a Bachelor Degree Examination in Education of this University or any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto, with a minimum of 50% marks in theory and practical components separately.

The basis of selection of candidates for admission shall be based on the existing regulations of the University/Government of Tamil Nadu Reservation of seats and other concessions for the SC, SC(A), ST, MBC/DNC, BC, BC(M) and other special categories of candidates notified by the Government of Tamil Nadu shall be provided in accordance with the statutory provisions of the Government of Tamil Nadu in force from time to time.

No candidate shall be eligible for the Degree of M.Ed unless he/she has completed the prescribed course of study and has passed the qualifying examinations (both in theory and practical components).

### **DURATION OF THE M.Ed PROGRAMME**

The M.Ed programme shall be of duration of two academic years including the theory courses, field attachment for a minimum of 8 weeks, and other practical components. Students shall be permitted to complete the programme requirements of the two-year programme with a maximum period of three years from the date of admission to the programme.

There shall be at least 200 working days for each academic year, exclusive of the period of admission and inclusive of classroom transaction, practicum, field study and conduct of examination. The institution shall work for a minimum of thirty six hours in a week (five or six days) during which faculty and students concerned with the conduct of the programme shall be available for interaction, dialogue, consultation and mentoring students.
